Appeal building, are reflections of the many ongoing issues emanating from the initial poor construction, followed by decades of neglect. The need for a new Courts of Appeal building has been established indisputably for more than 15 years, yet planning and design have been repeatedly pushed out for years at a time. In the meantime, the existing facility, long past its intended useful life, has deteriorated, so much so that the many issues may now present health and safety concerns on multiple fronts. Decades of neglect have, unfortunately, placed the appellate courts in the position of needing to relocate with due speed, but with no place to go. Capital funds have yet again been moved to the out years. Due to the urgency of the situation, and the repeated removal of Capital funds, the Judiciary placed design money, not construction money, in its operating budget to begin the planning of the much-needed new Courts of Appeal building.

The Judiciary agreed to the removal of the funding in the Judiciary's operating budget and is requesting that the General Assembly adjust the Capital Budget and make design funding for this critical need available in 2020 and 2021 and construction funding available in 2022 and 2023.
