Thank you for this opportunity to respond to the Department of Legislative Services (DLS) analysis of the Maryland Department of Aging's (Department's) FY 2022 budget request. The Department would like to extend its appreciation to the DLS analyst, Grace Pedersen, for her thoughtful analysis. The Department's response to the discussion items and the recommendation noted in the analysis are included below.

Discussion Items

1. The agency should be prepared to indicate when it expects contract agreements to be executed for the Harford Road Senior Center Project and the Hampton Park Senior Center Project.

The Department plans to present the Hampton Park Senior Center Project to the Board of Public Works as soon as possible. The Hampton Park Senior Center is currently under construction.

Regarding the Harford Road Senior Center Project, the department requested a consolidated plan from Baltimore City in July of 2020 incorporating their FY 2017 and FY 2020 requests under this program. Baltimore City continues to move forward with the planning of the project.

2. The agency should indicate when it expects the \$5.1 million authorized before fiscal 2020 to be expended.

The chart below depicts the estimated completion date of each project and when funds are expected to be expended. This information was provided by the Area Agencies on Aging (AAA). The Department's objective is to expend funds associated with each project as soon as the project is complete; however, as these are construction projects, there are often unanticipated delays that postpone expending the funds.

3. The agency should indicate whether it expects to expend \$800,000 authorized in fiscal 2015 before the authorization expires at the end of this fiscal year.

Recommended Actions

The Department of Legislative Services recommends the committees adopt the following narrative: Update on Program Administration and Outreach: Given the importance of senior centers to the communities they serve, the committees are concerned about the underutilization of the Senior Center Capital Grants Program. The committees request the Maryland Department of Aging (MDOA) provide an update that includes the following information:

- A summary of MDOA's administrative and outreach activities performed throughout each month of the annual grant cycle;
- The department's current understanding of the capital needs of senior centers throughout the State, including any data to support this evaluation;
- Factors that affect local government's participation in the program, including any data that supports these findings; and
- A vision statement describing how the department plans to administer the program, and once achieved, how the department envisions senior centers throughout the State will be supported by the program.

The Department would be pleased to provide such a report.
