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Amendment #6 to Request for Proposals (RFP) Project No. DPSCS Q0010022 INMATE PHARMACY SERVICES February 8, 2011

This Amendment is being issued to amend and clarify certain information contained in the above named RFP. All information contained herein is binding on all Offerors who respond to this RFP. Specific parts of the RFP have been amended. The following changes/additions are listed below; new language has been double underlined and marked in bold (ex. new language deleted has been marked with a strikeout (ex. language deleted).

1. Amend RFP §3.34.1 as follows:

The Contractor shall provide a copy of the Contractor's current certificate of insurance that, at a minimum, shall contain the following:

Worker's Compensation – The Contractor shall maintain such insurance as necessary and/or as required under Worker's Compensation Acts, the Longshore and Harbor Workers' Compensation Act, and the Federal Employee's Liability Act.

Errors and Omissions – The Contractor shall purchase and maintain Errors and Omissions liability coverage in the minimum amount of: \$1,000,000.

Commercial General Liability – The Contractor shall purchase and maintain at least the following insurance protection for liability claims arising as a result of the Contractor's operations under this Contract:

\$10,000,000 <u>\$7,000,000</u>: General Aggregate Limit (including without limitation druggist coverage and other than products/completed operations)

\$2,000,000: Products/completed operations aggregate limit

\$1,000,000: Each Occurrence Limit

\$1,000,000: Personal and Accidental Injury Limits

\$50,000: Fire Damage Limit \$5,000: Medical Expense

2. Amend RFP §4.4, Tab D as follows:

4. An Offeror shall include in its staffing plan, at a minimum, four (4) five (5) Clinical Pharm. D's to cover each service delivery area. These pharmacists and their schedules shall be identified to the agency, assigned only to this contract, and shall

not have responsibilities for any other contract. The Offeror shall also include in its plan a disease management program that outlines potential cost savings for inpatient and offsite care related to cardiac, diabetes, HCV, HIV, INR and wound care management infectious diseases directly related to the use of clinical pharmacy.
